



Who was Jean Monnet?


 A French cognac trader who left school age 16 to travel the world, discovered the power of collective action, devoted his life to uniting people, and launched the European integration project.

« We are not coalescing States, we are uniting People »



Why "Jean Monnet Actions"?

Jean Monnet believed that triggering real, deep change required focusing all efforts on one decisive action. Today, the most important driver to building a united Europe is education.







« Nothing is impossible if one is able to concentrate on one precise point that drives the rest »





Why "Jean Monnet Actions"?

 Jean Monnet was the first « salesman of Europe ». He knew how to convince people of the need for European unity, using simple words which everyone could understand, and which still resonate today. He was, fundamentally, a master European educator.

«A time comes when the best we can do is to teach what we think to be right »

Scope of Jean Monnet actions

European Union studies refer to the study of Europe in teaching, learning and research about the European Union, its entirety, its history, aims structures, functions and/or its policies.



Scope of Jean Monnet actions

EU Dimension Focus

Jean Monnet activities should promote active European citizenship and the founding values of the European Union of respect for human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, the rule of law and respect for human rights, including the rights of persons belonging to minorities (Article 2 of the Treaty on European Union).

EU Policy Focus

Jean Monnet actions should contribute to spreading knowledge about how these policies can benefit the daily lives of citizens in the EU and/or abroad, and/or how these can influence the policymaking system, in similar fields, either at the Member State level or abroad at a national, regional or global level. A link should be displayed between the subject of the proposal and the relevant EU policy or topic(s).

Public Diplomacy Focus

Jean Monnet actions also strive to function as a vector of public diplomacy towards third countries.

They should promote EU values and enhance the visibility of what the European Union stands for and what it intends to achieve.





Jean Monnet actions in the field of Higher Education – Teaching and Research Call - Aims

- Promoting excellence in teaching and research in EU studies worldwide
- Generating knowledge and insights; supporting EU policy-making, while strengthening the role of the EU within Europe and the world
- Reaching new people; going beyond academia and specialised audiences, bringing EU knowledge closer to society in the process
- Fostering dialogue between academia and society, policymakers, civil servants, civil society, representatives of different levels of education, and the media
- Functioning as a vector for public diplomacy towards partner/third countries, promoting EU values while enhancing the visibility of its goals and achievements



Who can apply?

Any Higher Education Institution in the world

Exception: Higher Education Institutions from Belarus and the Russian Federation

HEIs established in EU Member States and third countries associated with the Programme must hold a valid ECHE (Erasmus Charter for Higher Education).

Jean Monnet actions in other fields of Education and Training – Teacher Training - Who can apply?

- Higher Education Institutions providing initial and/or in-service training to teachers of schools and/or VET institutions (ISCED 1 - 4) and holding a valid ECHE; OR
- **Teacher training institutions** or agencies providing initial and/or in- service training to teachers of schools and/or VET institutions (ISCED 1 4).





Jean Monnet actions in other fields of Education and Training – Teacher Training - Aims

The Jean Monnet Teacher Training/Education should include the preparation and delivery of teacher training/education. These activities may take the form of targeted courses or modules including distance learning (MOOC and/or blended activities).

Jean Monnet Teacher Training/Education must respect one of the following:

- training about teaching methodologies in order to address European Union matters;
- training on European Union matters;
- learning experiences on European Union subjects which complement already existing courses (collaborative learning among classes, co-teaching);
- seminars, summer and intensive courses, other kinds of EU experiences involving other stakeholders.

Jean Monnet Policy Debate

Large thematic networks in Higher Education in order to collect, share and discuss among the partners research findings, content of courses and experiences, products (studies, articles, etc.). The coordinator of the network selects the most innovative and interesting results to be provided to the Commission.

- A) Network on EU internal policy: "An economy that works for people"
- B) Network on external policy: "EU-Latin America"
- C) Network on external policy: "EU-Africa"



A) Network on EU internal: "An economy that works for people"

Eligibility

EU Member States or third countries associated with the Erasmus+ Programme.

Composition

A minimum consortium of at least 12 higher education institutions from applicants, consisting of at least 7 different EU Member States and/or third countries associated with the Erasmus+ Programme. Only beneficiaries (not affiliated entities) count for the consortium composition.



Maximum EU Contribution:

1,000,000 EUR



B) Network on external policy: "EU-Latin America"

Eligibility

- A HEI established in the EU Member States and third country associated with the Erasmus+ Programme
- A HEI established or in the following third countries not associated to the Erasmus+ Programme: Latin America countries (region 10) and Caribbean countries (region 11)
- Institutions from Belarus and the Russian Federation are not eligible to participate.

Composition

Proposals must be submitted by a consortium of at least 12 applicants which complies with the following conditions:

- Minimum 5 entities from 5 different countries in Region Latin
 America (region 10);
- The coordinator has to be established in a EU Member State or a third country associated with the Erasmus+ Programme.
- Only beneficiaries (not affiliated entities) count for the consortium composition.



Maximum EU Contribution:

1,200,000 EUR



C) Network on external policy issues: "EU-Africa"

Eligibility

- A HEI established in EU Member States and third country associated with the Erasmus+ Programme
- A HEI established in the following third countries not associated to the Erasmus+ Programme: Sub Saharan Africa countries (region 9); Algeria, Egypt, Libya, Morocco, Tunisia (Region 3) may also participate but not as coordinator
- Institutions from Belarus and the Russian Federation are not eligible to participate.

Composition

Proposals must be submitted by a consortium of at least 10 applicants which complies with the following conditions:

- Minimum 5 entities from 5 different countries in Region Sub Saharan Africa (region 9);
- The coordinator has to be established in an EU Member State or third country associated with the Erasmus+ Programme.
- Only beneficiaries (not affiliated entities) count for the consortium composition.



Maximum EU Contribution:

1,200,000 EUR





D) Networks in other fields of Education and Training

 Who can apply? EU Member States or third countries associated with the Erasmus+ Programme

Aims

- Offer support to schools & VETs (ISCED 1 4), and/or Higher Education Institutions involved in Teacher Training/Education for boosting knowledge on how to teach European Union subjects;
- Exchange of knowledge, collaborative working on specific subjects and on methodologies, co-teaching experiences;
- Enhancing cooperation between different schools/VETs (ISCED 1 4), teacher training/education providers; creating a solid and sustainable knowledge platform.

Maximum EU Contribution: 300,000 EUR



Award Criteria

Although there are slight differences between Jean Monnet actions, to be considered for funding proposals must score at least 70/100 points in total and 15/25 points in each award criterion. There are four award criteria and each is worth a maximum of 25 points.

Quality of the project design and implementation

2021 – 2027 Funding Mechanisms

- Focus on outputs, rather than inputs
- Emphasis on quality and level of achievement of measurable objectives





Tips for Applications

Be coherent!

Avoid contradictions and "cut and paste" style applications

Be explicit!

Take nothing for granted and don't assume that experts have prior knowledge in your area. Avoid abbreviations or explain them.

· Be clear!

Read the questions carefully, provide information in the correct order as indicated in the form.

Be concrete!

Use examples, justify your claims, provide evidence.

Be realistic!

The application is the basis of your project to be; it is also the cornerstone of the commitment you will sign.

Keep it simple!

Use short sentences, vary the length if you wish to make it more interesting but keep it simple and focused.

Remain focused!

Concentrate exclusively on what is asked of you.

Double-check your proposal!

Make sure you have followed all instructions and the proposal meets all mandatory requirements.
